Examiners' Comments on the 2006 Examination

Head III: Commercial and Company Law

The examination covered a range of questions from the syllabus which enabled

candidates to illustrate their knowledge and practical understanding of Hong Kong

commercial and company law. The usual problem of candidates providing pre-prepared

answers to questions regardless of the actual question asked was still in evidence. For

example, many candidates still provided one unequivocal answer to questions that are

designed to invite an analytical discussion of various options available to the client

arising from a set of facts concerning different legal issues. When this happened, the

candidates invariably failed to answer the specific question asked.

In addition, some candidates failed to allocate an appropriate proportion of time. They

did three reasonably good questions and a very poor last question because they misjudged

their timekeeping and left insufficient time to answer the last question.

On the other hand, there was a small proportion of candidates who demonstrated a sound

knowledge of the syllabus, producing thoughtful and logical answers supported by

appropriate references to case law and legislation.
